Broward JIC Snapshot #33: Test Collection Sites Expand; Hospitals to Report Stats

Florida Department of Health in Broward (DOH-Broward), in collaboration with Broward County Parks & Recreation Division, has announced two new drive-through test collection sites:

- Markham Park 16001 W. State Road 84 in Sunrise Opened Wednesday, August 4
- C.B. Smith Park 900 N. Flamingo Road in Pembroke Pines Opens Thursday, August 5

This brings the total number of <u>DOH-Broward operated test collection sites</u> in Broward to six, plus a site at Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport catering to travelers. Additionally, testing is offered by retail pharmacies, including CVS and Walgreens, urgent care centers and physician practices.

COUNTY EMERGENCY DIRECTIVE 21-A REQUIRES HOSPITALS TO REPORT DATA

County Administrator Bertha Henry has issued an emergency directive requiring hospitals to report certain data on a daily basis, in order to better track community resources for COVID-19 cases requiring hospitalization. The effort will collect such information as number of available intensive care beds and ventilators, and number of new patients admitted daily. Broward and Miami-Dade County are now reporting the highest number of new COVID-19 hospitalizations in the nation. More...
