activities and volunteer advisory boards. Our Town Clerk has a registry of residents interested in serving on advisory boards. These boards' sunset annually and applicants are reviewed by the sitting Council Members for appointment. All advisory board meetings are open to the public and published on our website and in the Town newsletter. The public is welcome to attend these meetings and by doing so you can see where you may like to put your footprint on the Town.

If advisory boards are not your style and you prefer rolling up your sleeves, this month's newsletter calls residents into action with activities ranging from Earth Day Awareness, National Arbor Day drawing contest for the kids.

Council Member Steve Breitkreuz

Since we have been a town, one of the things that has evolved within our town is the

Fire and EMS Protection providers. We have had combination service between BSO and Davie. We have had BSO provide protection to the town. We have had Pembroke Pines protect our town and we currently have Davie protecting our town. Each has done an exceptional job.

The other element of fire protection has been our Volunteer Fire staff. This has grown into a highly professional team, led by Chief Bennett and Assistant Chief Kastner. They have done an exceptional job of taking what was originally a pure volunteer organization and implementing a structure and stability to where it now it is an important supplement to our Davie service providers. Specifically they provide large animal rescue skills, off road vehicles and skills in addressing fires that normal apparatus and individuals cannot address, as well as providing the personnel to attend a scene till it is completely resolved, allowing the primary Davie equipment to go back in service.

However, with all those benefits, the direction of these fire services is still yet to be determined. We have contracted out for a consultant to review our service providing structure and provide expertise to help us determine the best way to move forward. Specifically, we are looking to determine if the all Town resources should be focused on the Davie provider and minimize the volunteer involvement, whether the

Volunteer involvement should become the primary provider, or if a combination model, similar to what we have today, should be continued and refined.

In speaking with the Chief and Assistant Chief, both who are strong and active residents in our town, they have clearly expressed that they as well are looking just to hear the best way forward and to implement that plan, regardless of the proposed approach. They are exceptional. We, as a town, are fortunate to have skilled unbiased individuals that are also residents and thus also are looking for the best use of our tax dollars as well as the optimum protection for our residents.

Keep an eye out for the results of this study. I am not sure, as I write this, what the recommendation will be. But I am sure that as a Town, and as a fire service, we will all be ready to move forward with whatever is best for the Town of Southwest Ranches.





Council Member Freddy Fisikelli

I am writing this article late as usual. I do this because I like to

keep everyone informed about what is happening around Town, it just takes a long time to get all the information together. I am sure many have the same problem! Now let's get on with the latest news. We have two new projects starting. One in our Town and one in Pembroke Pines. In Pines, they annexed vacant land that originally was Broward County's long before we became a Town. It is within our Town boundary (US 27 to the west, Flamingo Road to the east, Sheridan Street to the south and Griffin Road to the north) but is governed by Pembroke Pines. This land was previously owned by the Weekley family, but was eventually purchased by Pembroke Pines. Pembroke Pines is currently installing a road to allow their residents to have the ability to go north and south since the Town closed down several of its own roads that diverted cut-through traffic which was a major problem for Town residents who live in that area. Now, Pines has sold the land to a not-for-profit organization called Franklin Academy Schools. They have plans to build a charter school on the vacant property mentioned previously, which will have classes for middle school and high school. They intend to build a recreation field with field lights for all types of sports. After the Town was aware of this, we attended a Pembroke Pines City Commission meeting when the plat was on the

agenda for consideration and stated the Town's case to not approve. It was eventually approved anyway so we had no choice but to file a lawsuit against the City because of their approval process and ambiguous traffic report.

The other issue that will be affecting our Town is that some of our residents have received a letter from the US Army Corps of Engineers stating there are approximately 41 acres of land owned by the Downey family located on the southwest corner of Bonaventure Boulevard and Griffin Road. The Downey family had plans to build a small residential community which will include sixteen homes. This project is also referred to as the Tara Plat which the family had applied for in 1995 but never moved forward with it until now. They sold the property to another party and plan to move forward with this project. They have met with Vice Mayor Gary Jablonski since the property lies within his Council district. The Vice Mayor has reported that he has advised the new owners that before they can move forward they will have to apply for a new site plan because the old Tara site plan has expired. The original plat required the developer to build a new road which will be SW 184th Avenue on the full length of the property, but to do this they would have to relocate the existing canal which was built by the old Baily Water Management District which now is under the management of the South Broward Drainage District. The canal was built at the wrong location. The Town requested a hearing on this project and once a date is available we will notify everyone.

Now for some good news! We are moving along with the construction of Fishing Hole Park. The Town has been notified that the contractor who built the playground and part of the horse trails has finished. The project to build the bathroom has been awarded and a preconstruction meeting was held with the contractor. The contractor is expected to commence work in two weeks. It is anticipated that this week we will have a meeting with everyone involved with this project to set up a future schedule for the rest of the project.


Southwest Ranches has taken part in Water Matters

The month of February your Southwest Ranches Fire Department has been training weekly on an Air Consumption Drill. The A. C. D. is a task that involves several labor intense fire fighting objectives and skills while wearing full bunker gear and self-contained breathing apparatus. It is a measure of one's ability to work hard at a fire/emergency scene and to see at the end of the drill how much air is left in the breathing apparatus.

The month of March has been dedicated to "May Day Drills". The May Day Drill is designed for a lost or trapped fire fighter. If a Fire fighter becomes lost or in a dangerous situation, this training may help to save There life. There will be several different training scenarios that will be used during this rugged training. The Southwest Ranches Fire Training Division built special props for the May Day training.

Southwest Ranches and Davie Fire Department are currently working on testing the wells through-out Southwest Ranches, to assure they are in good working order. They will continue for the next few weeks covering all wells through-out the Ranches.

Do you have a home improvement-project that requires earthwork, such as excavation, grading, or filling? Then you need a permit. are based on three factors. How

An applicant must follow the following steps in the process of obtaining a fill, excavation and site grading permit:

- I) Obtain an "Environmental Review Approval" from Broward County Development and Environmental Regulation Division. You may obtain the "Environmental Review Approval" online at: http://www.broward.org/epermits
- 2) Contact the appropriate drainage district and obtain their approval. A property located east of Volunteer Road (SW 148th Avenue) should contact the Central Broward Water Control District (tel. 954-432-5110). A property located west of Volunteer Road should contact the South Broward Drainage

District (tel. 954-680-3337).

3) Complete the Fill, Excavation and Site Grading Permit Application and provide the Broward County Environmental Review Approval and drainage district approval to the Town Engineering Department in Town Hall located at 13400 Griffin Road. A drawing showing the activity on the property is required. This may be shown on a boundary and topographic survey. The application will be processed according to the level of fill activity and size of the property. Processing fees for fill permits are based on the level of the permit application.

Fill Levels:

The requirements for obtaining a fill permit

are based on three factors. How large the property is, location of fill on property, and how much fill is being brought in. To determine your level, please refer to the table below. By finding your property size and how much fill you plan to bring in, you can determine what level you will be. **Please note the following:**

- One large truck of fill is about 18 cubic yards (C.Y.).
- Level I is for maintenance purposes only.
- The amount of fill that is brought in is not based on a particular project but is based on the total fill that is brought in during any continuous 12-month period of time (e.g. May 2013 through April 2014).
