By the time you get this newsletter the Fourth of July will have come and gone and all

the fireworks have been set off. I hope everyone had a good time and nobody was injured, but now it is time to get back to work on some of the most pressing things that will be coming up in the future.

The one that I talked about in my last newsletter is the part of Griffin Road from SW 188th Avenue to US 27 which is still a two-lane road. The question is, does it need to be made a four lane road like the rest of Griffin? This road belongs to Broward County and they would be the one to do so.

The first step we must take is the Town of Southwest Ranches must pass a resolution that we are in favor of having it done. At our last Council meeting I made the suggestion that we should do this, but after a discussion the Council decided that we needed to bring it back to the Council as a discussion item. Because of the July 4th holiday, it was decided to do it at the July 24th meeting.

In order to meet our printing deadline, I am writing this column before that meeting, so I can't update you now, but will in my next article. I have worked hard to listen to as many opinions on this as I can, as it is very important the Council understands what our residents think about this. If the Council decides this needs to be done, we will pass a resolution stating that decision, then send that resolution to the MPO of Broward County. At the present time they have it on their 20 year plan to be done, we need to ask them to move it from their 20 year plan to the five year plan so it can be funded.

• Adopted Ordinance 2014-004 authorizing three questions that would amend the Town Charter to be placed on the November 2014 ballot which would exempt elected officials and advisory board members from disclosing outside employment compensation, and also clarifying the definition of "lobbyist."

• Passed on first reading, an ordinance that would allow the construction of roof eaves without impacting overall plot coverage.

Several questions were received regarding traffic enforcement by the Davie Police Department. The questions centered on two areas. I) It seems like the Davie Police are writing more traffic tickets than BSO did, if so, why? 2) Where does the money go?

To begin, Davie is writing more tickets than BSO was at the end of their contract. When Davie took over law enforcement services for the Town in February, they were directed to enforce speed limits and stop signs in the Town. While I made this request as Town Administrator, it was by resident request. I had heard from many residents (dozens) about the unsafe conditions on our local roads. In some areas, residents were afraid to walk their dogs, jog or walk, or ride bicycles. As much as we might like to blame the cutthrough traffic, in many cases it was our own friends and neighbors who needed to slow down and be more careful. The Davie PD was directed to help calm our traffic conditions, and I believe they have done a good job. While I still have occasional complaints about speeders, in most areas their efforts have helped slow traffic down.

For tickets issued in Southwest Ranches, the municipal portion of the tickets are received by the Town. The funds are received here in Southwest Ranches, they do not go to the Town of Davie. While it is not a large amount of money to the Town, the money received is placed into our budget and supports our efforts in maintaining our Town.

Invasion of the Native Snatchers -**Invasive Exotics 101**

ROUM

Invasive plants are a major threat. Across the U.S., invasive plants infest 7 million acres of our national park lands. State and private lands are also plagued with invasive plants.

SO WHY SHOULD YOU CARE?

Diverse native vegetation in Florida's wetlands, lakes and forests supports a great variety of birds and wildlife. Invasive plants threaten these delicate ecosystems, reducing the availability of food and suitable cover that wild animals depend upon. Control of invasive exotics costs Florida taxpayers millions of dollars each year. If invasive plants win, the native plants and wildlife lose, and so do the people who enjoy them.

Left to grow unchecked, invasive plants:

- are spreading on almost all private and public lands,
- can harm the natural ecology of our wetlands, prairies, forests, lakes, and rivers

• can limit many uses on land, decreasing ours and future generations' ability to enjoy hunting, fishing, bird watching, and other recreational pursuits.

WHAT IS AN INVASIVE EXOTIC?

An invasive exotic plant is a plant that has been introduced to an area from outside its native range, either

purposefully or accidentally, that expands into natural areas, and disrupts naturally occurring native communities. "Invasives" are aggressive, grow and reproduce rapidly, and cause major changes to the areas where they become established.

WHAT CAN YOU DO?

You can help. Learn to recognize invasive plants and take steps to control them: • Require your landscapers to clean equipment before they bring it onto your property - seeds travel from place to place in many ways, such as on tire treads and undercarriages.

• Don't be a vector! Many invasive plant seeds "hitchhike" on clothing, shoes, your pet's fur and even your boat or watercraft. Check for seeds or plant parts and clean equipment, boots, animals, and gear when leaving an infested area. Dispose of these in a plastic bag in a trash can.

• Remove visible plant parts, animals, and mud from your boat, kayak or other watercraft and drain all water before leaving a waterbody.

STARTING AT HOME

Invasive species can invade your garden; their seeds spread freely from your land to your neighbor's, to swales and nearby waterways, germinating and taking hold. The best way to prevent the spread of invasive plants is to not plant them in the first place. Just because a plant is sold in a nursery or store, doesn't mean it's not invasive! Avoid using invasive species in your garden; don't share invasive species with others.

Pass it on! Make sure to tell your friends,

neighbors and family what you're doing to fight the spread of invasive exotic plants in Florida.

Invasive exotics that cause harm in Florida are not just plants, but also animals. Never release pets or animals into the wild without getting advice or a permit from local authorities.

INVASIVE EXOTIC PLANTS: MYTHS AND FACTS

MYTH: All non-native species are bad.

FACT: Many introduced species do not cause problems and can be important for agriculture, horticulture, medicine, or other uses. It is difficult to know if an introduced species will become invasive. so great caution should be used when importing or planting new species.

MYTH: Invasive species don't spread from urban and suburban areas to natural areas.

FACT: Seeds of invasive plants can be carried in many ways-by wind, by birds eating fruits and depositing the seeds elsewhere, by water carrying seeds from your yard into swales and canals, or by car tires or shoe treads when you travel.

MYTH: Aren't all plants "good"?

FACT: All plants make oxygen and absorb carbon dioxide. That's good. However, factors that keep invasive exotics under control in their native range may not be present in the area where they're introduced. Without these, invasives are free to grow, reproduce, displace and disrupt naturally-balanced native plant communities.



DRAIN and COVER

DRAIN standing water to stop mosquitoes from multiplying.

- Discard: Old tires, drums, bottles, cans, pots and pans, broken appliances and other items that are not being used.
- Empty and Clean: Birdbaths and pet's water bowls at least once or twice a week.
- Protect: Boats and vehicles from rain with tarps that do not accumulate water.
- Maintain: The water balance (pool chemistry) of swimming pools. Empty plastic swimming pools when not in use.
- **COVER** your skin with clothing and use mosquito repellent.
- Clothing: If you must be outside when mosquitoes are active, cover up. Wear shoes, socks, long pants, and long sleeves.
- Repellent: Apply mosquito repellent to bare skin and clothing. Always use repellents according to the label. Repellents with DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, and IR3535 are effective. Use mosquito netting to protect children younger than 2 months.
- **COVER** doors and windows with screens to keep mosquitoes out.
- Keep mosquitoes out of your house. Repair broken screens on windows, doors, porches, and patios.






