Happy 4th of July! This is a great time of year when we can celebrate our great country and

also enjoy all of the traditions that come with the 4th. I wish you and your family the very best on this 4th of July.

I also wanted to report on an update regarding the traffic signal on Griffin at I-75. This is the new signal that was installed about 6 months ago. I was able to meet with Scott Brunner from Broward County. We made several recommendations to him including re-sequencing the signal so that traffic can flow more independently between that traffic that is going south on I-75 off west bound Griffin and that traffic that is going west on Griffin after exiting off of southbound I-75. They really are two totally independent traffic patterns as one does not affect the other. It was pointed out to me, however, that even though this light has two independent flows, drivers' expectations are tied together and need to be factored in for safety reasons. So, that is still being reviewed to see what can be done. Another recommendation is that after a certain hour that the signal turn to blinking yellow / red, similar to the signal on Griffin and Bonaventure as well as Griffin and Volunteer. I am hopeful that can be accomplished as well.

We are also continuing to work on the traffic issues out west in the 185th / 190th area. The process is moving slower than I had hoped. However, town administration is working diligently and progress is being made. I am very hopeful that we will see those initial improvements to 185th / 186th / 188th in the coming weeks.



STAY IN TOUCH WITH CODE

Fill for horse stalls do not require a fill permit. In addition, a permit may not be required if a small amount of sand is required to replenish a horse arena. However the Town recommends that property owners or lease contact our office to assure that the type of work being performed falls under this criteria prior to performing the work. A phone call to us will help prevent a possible warning from Code Enforcement and double fees when it comes to acquiring the required permit.

Non-Commercial Farm Recommendation Presentation

Lately at some of the meetings held in our Town, the new charter school to be built

on SW 208 Avenue has been discussed. One of the objections was it would cause an increase of the traffic on that part of Griffin Road, which is presently two lanes from SW 185 Avenue to US 27, it has not been increased to four lanes.

The question was asked why it had never been increased to four lanes like the rest of Griffin from SW 184 Avenue to Flamingo Road. To answer that question you need to go back to when Arvida owned the land and wanted to build homes there. They were able to work out a deal with the Broward County Engineering Department which gave them the right to build a bridge on SW 184 Avenue and Griffin Road over which their south bound traffic could use instead of having to build Orange Drive. Also, they had to agree to Increase Griffin Road to four lanes from SW 186 Avenue to I-75. I have never seen this agreement but have been told about it numerous times. and I am sure if you look for it, you'll find it.

After we were granted permission to form our Town, Broward County agreed to help us. They appointed John Canada, who was an employee of Broward County, to help us to get organized. John began holding meetings with all the departments we would need in our town. At one of the meetings with the road department, the question came up was when would Arvida begin changing Griffin Road to four lanes as they had agreed to in the construction of the bridge. We were informed that had been changed and they had agreed they were only

going to improve the intersections. We informed them that was not what had been agreed to with the construction of the new bridge and they have to have Griffin Road made four lanes. They went back to Arvida with a new agreement, one which made Arvida responsible to construct the section of Griffin Road from SW 188 Avenue to SW 172 Avenue, and Broward County would be responsible to construct the section from SW 172 Avenue to I-75.

In June 2002, Broward County notified us that Arvida had hired Ryan Construction Company to build the road and it would be supervised by the Broward County Engineering Department, along with CCL Consultants, Inc. I was appointed by the Council to oversee this project and myself and Lee Rickles attended all the meetings. This is why that section of Griffin Road was never made four lanes, it was because Arvida was not made to do it.



Brief legislation from the May 8, 2014 Town Council meeting:

- Approved a Waiver of Plat to subdivide a 4.6 acre lot to create 2 lots of 2.3 acres each.
- Approved a Site Plan to develop six lots of one acre each.
- Adopted Resolution 2014-037 authorizing the engagement of G.W. Bulldozing for earthwork and tree clearing at County Estates Fishing Hole Park.

Brief legislation from the May 22, 2014 Town Council meeting:

- Adopted Resolution 2014 038 approving a donation from the Aster Knight Parks Foundation for Change Orders to the Rolling Oaks Barn Renovation project.
- Adopted Ordinance 2014-003 creating a floodplain management program.

BULK YARD TRASH

Residential contracted Landscaper debris and or nursery debris will not be removed in bulk collection at residence...

Homeowners are held responsible for ensuring that Construction contractors and landscape maintenance providers remove any debris generated by their services.

Must be part of normal yard maintenance, including tree trimmings, branches, palm fronds and other yard trash where no single item exceeds four (4) feet in length or 50 pounds in weight.

 Must be placed curb side in a neat and orderly manner that facilitates safe collection with a overhead grapple truck.

- Residents are permitted to place out for collection a maximum of twelve (12) cubic yards in total of bulk waste combined.
- Loose items must be placed in a bag, box, carton or crate that can be safely lifted without breaking and weigh no more than 50 pounds.
- Glass items must be in a rigid container.
- Bulk Waste should not be placed out any earlier than the Saturday before your scheduled collection day and no later than 7 a.m. on collection day.

Bulk Waste Collection Guidelines

Bulk Trash must be placed separate from both Yard Trash and Solid Waste (Garbage) and must be generated by the customer at the residence where it is being collected.

Commercial businesses, nurseries and landscapers are prohibited from placing anything out for collection. They must have a commercial dumpster on site.

Items that cannot be included in normal collection:

- Hazardous or exempt waste: motor oils, paint, batteries, pesticides, biological sludge, auto or boat parts and horse manure.
- Construction, remodeling, concrete, chain link and demolition debris.
- Material generated from land clearing, land development or hurricane storm debris.
- Automotive bodies, engines, transmissions, batteries, tires of any size and other automotive and marine parts.

Bulk Trash

Includes but is not limited to: large appliances, (doors and refrigerators removed), couches, chairs, mattresses, tables, lumber, carpets and padding.




A Message from Our Town Administrator...

CODE ENFORCEMENT AND YOU: NEW ORDINANCE SNIPE SIGNS AND POLITICAL SIGNS TO BE LITTER IF ON THE RIGHT OF WAY

The Town of Southwest Ranches Council amended Article 70 of our code which is entitled "Signs". This article is part of our Unified Land Development Code better known as ULDC. The specific section that we would like to bring to your attention is the section that relates to "prohibited signs." There are a number of prohibited signs outlined in this article of the Code. The Council included "snipe signs" as part of the prohibited signs and classified them as litter if located within the right of way of the Town.

Snipe signs are those types of signs that many times can be found on intersections or main highways around town. Basically these signs serve as a

mode of advertisement for a specific business or perhaps a resident. This encompasses political signs that are located within the confines of the rights of ways. It does not apply to political signs that are located within the confines of a private property.

When the sign is located within the private property, the section allows for one sign per frontage of property for each candidate and issue. The Town continues to see a proliferation of these types of signs; and since the owners do not pick them up, it has begun to create a very unpleasant look to our Town. In an effort to curve this issue Article 70 of the Code was amended to allow anyone from the public in addition to

the Code Enforcement Officer or Town representative to collect and dispose of them as litter. As the election season approaches the Department wanted to provide you with information and a reminder of the code that is in place.

There is a difference between these types of signs and those that are found along roads such as real estate signs, or other signs which are properly permitted.
