October signifies the beginning of a new budget (fiscal) year for

the Town of Southwest Ranches. Budget preparations began in February and along the way have been shaped by resident, Town Council, and staff input. I'm very proud of our transparent budget process. We held a budget workshop in August, and held our first budget hearing on September 15th. Our second budget hearing is scheduled for September 30th at 6 p.m. While we have kept our millage at the "Historic Rate" of 3.9404 it is important to note that you will see an increase in the millage rate. The increase is directly attributable to the required funding for the Transportation Surface Drainage Ongoing Rehabilitation (TSDOR) capital improvement project. The TSDOR project will provide much needed repaving for the Town's roads.

The proposed budget for Fiscal Year 2015 discussed at the first hearing on September 15th is balanced. The budget maintains the high levels of service which Southwest Ranches residents desire and have come to expect. I'm happy to report that the Town is in a sound financial position.

I encourage you to attend our second budget hearing on September 30th at 6 p.m. I, and the rest of the Town Council, welcome your input if you have any suggestions about Town service delivery and how best to pay for it. We look forward to your attendance.

As always, it is an honor and pleasure to serve you!

## Council Member Freddy Fisikelli

I hope you receive this newsletter in time to be able to address a couple

of things that was discussed at the last Town Council meeting. The Town administrator decided to put on the agenda a resolution recommending the adoption of amendments to the objectives and policies within several elements of the adopted Town of Southwest Ranches comprehensive plan pertaining to Broward County land use (BCLUP) consistency requirements, intergovernmental coordination, and local street connections. This caused a very heated discussion from the public, so the Council member Steve Breitkreuz made a motion to table that item so that more people would be able to be at the next time it would be on the Council's agenda. Make sure check when this will be scheduled so you can be there to voice your opinion. Also at the same meeting he made the decision to have a discussion a modification of the contracts for Planning and zoning permit review to try and cut the cost that people are paying now but in my opinion that cost can be cut more if you look at what other Cities are paying for the same services. This was brought to us without the proper information. If you look at what we are paying now which is \$459 per permit and brake that down as I did it figures to take 19 hours to do the work and that is too much so we need some information on what other cities are doing to cut their cost. I hope I have be able to inform you of some of the problems coming up in the future.



### Vice Mayor Gary Jablonski

Although the slew of television advertisements

have properly alerted you, in case you have missed them, there is an important election next month. For this Town, this is the first election where we have no candidates. District One and District Two's Council members were unopposed, and as such, Council Member Breitkreuz, and myself will retain our Council seats for four more years commencing in November.

The Town does have three Charter Amendments on the ballot that I would like to bring to your attention. These three Charter Amendments are very important as they help to maintain our rural identity by encouraging open dialogue with our residents. by protecting our community boards, and by making sure that service on the Council is not treated as a full time job. The three amendments all relate to one question from the 2010 election, which was put on the ballot by the Broward County Commission. It simply asked if we wanted ethics reform. Of course the majority of voters said yes. After it passed, the County Commission proceeded to write the law. The consequence of that law has led us to this point where almost every conversation between a Council Member or the Mayor with an interested resident could be treated as if they are a lobbyist, subjecting everyone to reporting requirements. By way of example, if Sue wants to meet with me to help her neighbor resolve a drainage issue, under the County's guidelines Sue must be treated as a lobbyist. As you can imagine, this requirement has put unfair conditions on our conversations with our residents. As such, the Town is seeking to clarify that our residents, in these types of scenarios, should not be

considered to be lobbyists.

The County's 2010 law also brought into question whether our residents who serve on advisory boards need to make financial disclosures to the State. and whether service on the Council should be treated as a full time job. All of the Town's advisory boards are made up of unpaid volunteers, who do not receive any compensation for their service to the Town. The Town Council is a part-time position, with at least four of us maintaining full time jobs. The County's law makes it mandatory for advisory board members to make financial disclosures to the State. Similarly, it requires each member of the Town Council to disclose their annual income, in addition to the source of that income. The result of this law limits the pool of residents who are willing to volunteer their time and expertise, since they wish for their financial matters to remain private. Similarly, this law limits those desiring to run for the Council. The Town's proposed amendment enables advisory board members to keep their financial affairs private. It also recognizes that service on the Council is a part-time position, and as such the Town Council has to report the source of its income. but not the amount of its income.

The reality is that although the County's law did a lot of good things, it's hard to apply a law written for the entire County on each municipality. The new law unintentionally hinders resident communications with Council Members, deters residents from volunteering on advisory boards, and limits the pool of candidates interested in serving on the Town Council. As such, the Town's proposed Charter Amendments seek to make the County's law more applicable to the Town.

I believe that these Charter Amendments will restore unbridled communication and more community involvement.

# CODE ENFORCEMENT PROCESS AND PROCEDURES THAT MUST BE FOLLOWED

The Town of Southwest Ranches has not been immune from the economic issues that plagued our Country since 2008. As a result we have a number of properties which have either been abandoned by owners or that are not being maintain by the Banks which now own them. The effect is clear, the properties are overgrown and the pools are not being cleaned or emptied from stagnant water, creating an unsafe site not to mention a nuisance to adjacent property owners.

The Code Enforcement Department maintains a current list of these locations and provides this information to the Town Police Department in an effort to keep a vigilant eye on them. In addition, we have levied high fines and liens which will have to be paid by the potential purchaser or the property. The Department also maintains a list of contractors which provide the services to the Town in an effort to correct the violations and provide a relief to adjacent property owners. The fees associated with the correction of the violation, becomes a lien on the property.

Many times we receive phone calls from concerned residents in regards to these properties and the time it takes before the violation is corrected. We want residents to know that there is a process in place which needs to be followed per Florida State Statute Chapter 162 and the Town Code of Ordinances. Both authorize the Town to issue fines and to impose a lien but notifications have to be made to the property owner of record. In addition we are required to provide an amount of time to correct the violation, and to seek authorization from a Special Magistrate to abate the property. This action cannot be done without the authorization as we would be violating Florida State Statue Chapter 162 and the process takes time. If the process is not followed we may find ourselves once again at the start of the process, delaying the correction and relief even further.

We want our residents and citizens to rest assured that the Department is on your side and is cognizant of your needs. We continue hard at work to get these properties under control.

## A Message from Our Town Administrator...

In recent action, the Town Council approved a recommendation to switch development review permitting from The Mellgren Planning Group (TMPG) to Code Services, Inc. (CSI). This Town Council action has reduced the development review permit fees the residents will pay by at least 40% due to CSI's lower operating costs.

Development review permits include items such as single family home con-

struction, fences, pools, and drive-ways. Previously, residents would go to TMPG's office in Davie for permits, but beginning October I, CSI will handle these permits from Town Hall, a much more convenient location. This shift was made possible by Council's recognition that our residents would be better served by offering this service within Town Hall.

Both firms have dependably served the Town for many years, and both will continue to do so. This is merely a changeover in one area of responsibility. Town staff will continue to work with the Mayor and Council to identify additional opportunities for us to improve our service to our residents. Comments and suggestions are always welcomed.
