



want touch on a couple of really important items that are going on in Town that I want to be sure that you were aware of. The first is that we will be having a workshop on the overall drainage in our Town. am sure evervone remembers, we had a major rainfall event this past November. While virtually all of the properties in Town flooded to one degree or another, the overall drainage plan worked as expected. However, I do not believe this was an isolated event and there is work to be done to ensure that next time we are even

better prepared.

To accomplish, after this, we will have this workshop on February 25th at 6:00 PM. We will start with a presentation on the drainage in our Town. I think there will be a number of things that may surprise you, and I believe it will be beneficial to all to learn more about how our drainage is There are more designed. elements to it than appears at first glance. We will discuss the number of water district Town and the pumps in advantages or disadvantages to adding more. We will discuss better ways and potential options for getting our large animals to higher ground temporarily. We will discuss areas of need for additional drainage structures with both Central Broward

Water Control District as well as South Broward District, so that we can see the best wavs that we can partner together.

I believe this is an important proactive effort that we can all participate in so that going forward we are more prepared than we have ever been, and I encourage you to attend. To ensure that as many individuals as possible can attend, we will have having this meeting as a virtual event that you call or Zoom into.

The second item that I want to touch on is a quick update on the Fire Fee Assessment. As you may be aware, we ran into an issue last year with our fire fee where the assessments for a number of our agricultural properties with barn structures were assessed at what I believe was an unfair rate. Working together with the Property Appraiser's office we were able to come up with a one time resolution for 2020.

However, there is significant work to be done to resolve this for good moving forward, and we are working on that. We need to have a proposal for the residents to read over and discuss in the next 60 days, hopefully sooner. It is critical that we ensure that our tax rate and fees are fair to all. And it is also critical that these rates recognize the unique rural nature of our Town and provide fees that protect our rural uses while remaining fair to all others in Town as

Howdy Folks. I'm writing this month to update you on

a couple of items currently before the Town that I feel concerns all of us. First, last month I discussed the several ways for residents to participate to make our Town stronger. I mentioned getting involved with your HOA or one of the advisory boards. The one advisory board with the most impact on our children is the Schools and Education Advisory Board. The board is tasked with following the meetings of the Broward County School Board and the happenings in the local schools to provide input to the Council concerning matters affecting the education of its residents. local schools Our have that scholarships provide financial assistance to only the children that live within the respective municipality. Our Town saw this as unfair treatment for our Town's students, and consequently we created the Southwest Ranches Scholarship Fund. Over the years, our scholarship fund has awarded our students significant scholarships to help with educational expenses. The students wishing to receive scholarships are reauired overcome many requirements to qualify. Moreover, the advisory board holds many events, such the Southwest Ranches Pageant to help raise funds. These were all fun events that attracted many residents. However, with the advent of the Covid-19 virus, all these big events could no longer take place. Logically, the cessation of the big fundraising events, adversely affected the available dollars to draw from for the scholarship fund. Presently, the scholarship fund is less than half of what it was a year ago, and this means far less funds to help our children with their educational expenses. Residents can contribute directly to the scholarship fund, and the contribution towards the scholarship fund is tax deductible. So, if you can find in your ability, please write a check payable to the Town of Southwest Ranches and in the memo designate that the funds are to go towards the Town Scholarship Fund. Every little bit helps and in the end the donation helps our Town.

The second item I want to write about concerns drainage. Last year, we all experienced the worst flooding that ever impacted our Town. For a long time, our Town has needed a Stormwater Master Plan to provide for long-range comprehensive stormwater management. Through the highly commendable hard work of both Rod Ley and Emily Aceti our Town was successful in obtaining a quarter of a million-dollar grant with NO Town spending match requirements from the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity. The purpose of these funds is to develop the Stormwater Master Plan. The goal is to accumulate and evaluate data to create hydraulic and hydrological models for both drainage and conveyance Russell Muniz. of water. Assistant Town Administrator/ Town Clerk was pivotal in helping facilitate the process, and we thank Russell. Rod and

Emily for the successful hard work.
The Drainage and Infrastructure
Advisory Board will be at the
forefront of the process.





In furtherance of the Town's goal of preserving its rural lifestyle, the Town Council has given residents a simpler mechanism to build a barn that is in compliance with Florida statutory requirements. As such, the Town contracted with an architect who agreed to create a prototype barn

drawing, in compliance with the Florida Building Code, which can be permitted for residents throughout the Town. The plans are for a three stall barn with a tack room.

A Town resident looking to build a barn can simply purchase a pre-drafted architectural plan from the Town, which they then can submit, at a reduced cost, and on an expedited basis, to get a permitted barn that will be in compliance with both state and local regulations.






