# Mayor Doug Mckay

Dear Residents.

We are fast approaching the end of our Fiscal Year (FY) 2017 budget. Over the past several months, Town staff has been working on proposing a budget to the Town Council for Fiscal Year 2018 that maintains the same level of service that we enjoy while minimizing the financial cost to property owners. While the Town experienced a 7.66% increase in property values, this only equates to an approximate \$77,000 of additional revenue to the Town. While additional revenue helps, we also experienced significant increases in the cost of services for waste collection. public safety, and necessary capital improvement projects. As proposed, the FY 2018 budget projects a moderate millage and fire assessment increase, and a significant increase to our solid waste assessment rates. The solid waste assessment increase is a result of a new contract for solid waste collection that was competitively bid, but due to market conditions is significantly higher than our previous vendor. The increase to our solid waste assessment will be a graduated increase due to Town Council action to utilize reserves to lessen its impact this year. Next year the use of reserves is not anticipated. so there will be an additional increase next year.

I, and the rest of your Town Council, take the responsibility of safeguarding your tax dollars very seriously. It is important to note that the pro-

posed budget and the associated increases are only a starting point. As your Mayor, I can assure you we have already begun the process of examining expenditure requests, where cost savings can be found, and if any additional funding opportunities are available. I urge you all to stay informed and attend one of our upcoming budget meetings or workshops (August 22 - Budget Workshop @ 7 pm; September 13th -First Public Hearing @ 6 pm; September 28th @ 6 pm). If you cannot attend First Public Hearing, please review our agendas, follow us on Facebook (@SWRGOV) or Twitter (@ SWR\_Gov) for meeting announcements, or watch videos of the meetings after they take place on You-Tube (Town of Southwest Ranches Official Channel).

# STAY IN TOUCE WITH ENGINEERING

Fill for horse stalls does not require a fill permit. In addition, a permit may not be required if a small amount of sand is required to replenish a horse arena. However the Town recommends that a property owner or leasee contact our office to assure that the type of work being performed falls under this criteria prior to performing the work. A phone call to us will help prevent a possible warning from Code Enforcement and double fees when it comes to acquiring the required permit.


# PROTOTYPE BARN

In furtherance of the Town's goal of preserving its rural lifestyle, the Town Council has given residents a simpler mechanism to build a barn that is in compliance with Florida statutory requirements. such, the Town contracted with an architect who agreed to create prototype barn a drawing, in compliance with the Florida Building Code, which can be permitted for residents throughout the Town. The plans are for a three stall barn with a tack room.

A Town resident looking to build a barn can simply purchase a pre-drafted architectural plan from the Town, which they then can submit, at a reduced cost, and on an expedited basis, to get a permitted barn that will be in compliance with both state and local regulations.

# **MAINTAIN YOUR SWALE**



In Southwest Ranches, swales can be found along the front of your property and are there to contain water runoff. The centerline of the swale is typically six inches below the edge of pavement. This ensures that the roads are clear after a rain event.

Do not fill them in or plant in these areas. The swale should be clear of all obstructions in order to work efficiently. You should keep your swale well-mowed and free of litter and debris so water can flow freely. Check swales periodically for both erosion or natural build-up of sediments. If water collects in the swale, leave it alone - it means the system is working!

A swale is one of the most common type of stormwater best management practice (BMP). Swales not only convey stormwater but also help to treat runoff by reducing nutrient loading. Because swales have a wide and relatively flat profile, rainwater collected within them is slowed significantly. The reduction in the velocity of the runoff promotes temporary ponding. Reducing the water's

speed allows for suspended solids such as heavy metals, eroded soil particles, and other pollutants to settle and filter into the swale's vegetation cover. Stormwater staging in the swale allows the water to percolate into the soil, helping to reduce the volume and amount of pollutants transported downstream. The pollutant reduction will

improve the water quality in surrounding water bodies.

### MAINTAIN YOUR SWALE

- \* Mow the swale.
- Remove and then compost leaves and grass clippings.
- \* Keep good grass growth.
- Minimize use of fertilizers, pesticides, and herbicides.
- ❖ Aerate soils to restore percolation rate.
- Inspect for erosion. Any damaged sod should be replaced immediately.

# DO NOT MISUSE YOUR SWALE

- Do not pile garbage, trash, leaves, limbs or debris in swales - this adds pollutants, which can wash into downstream waters.
- Do not park vehicles in the swale - this compacts the soil so less runoff is absorbed.
- Do not plant trees or shrubs or place obstructions within the swale.

# LET THE WATER POND

Runoff should temporarily pond in the swale for up to 72 hours.

# **CODE ENFORCEMENT AND YOU:**

# New Collection Company starting October 1, 2017 Bulk Issues and Responsibilities of Residents

The Code Enforcement Department managed by Code Services Inc. is in charge of enforcing the bulk ordinance as well as any trash related issues that were passed by the Town Council. Beginning October 1, 2017, the Town of Southwest Ranches has changed vendor for the collection of bulk.

Below is a refresher of issues that we encounter as well as the responsibilities for residents when it relates to bulk collection.

• As required by code the property owners are required to place bulk out for pick up starting on the Saturday prior the collection week (as per the schedule). If you place the bulk items on the Friday prior to collection week, you will be in violation of the requirements of the code.

## **Enforcement Action**

If bulk items are placed in violation of what was indicated above, then:

• Code Enforcement is required to issue a warning notice of violation for the first time, and a civil violation notice for any other occurrence as long as the property ownership remains the same. A warning notice does not carry any penalty, but a civil violation carries a penalty of \$500.00 per occurrence.

We make every effort to provide information to the residents such as articles, delivery of schedules in the form of a magnet and copies of the schedule with the warning notices, in an effort to avoid the issuance of a civil penalty. As such new schedules are being deliver by the Town to all residents, and information is being

distributed in various forms as well.

# Other important guidelines to follow

- It is imperative for resident to understand that bulk from your property needs to be placed in the front area of your property and between the confines of your property lines. It is illegal; and is consider to be illegal dumping, to place bulk generated from your property in other resident's property, and beyond your property lines. We complaints received residents are placing bulk across the way from their property to avoid damage to the front of their properties (such as grass removal) when the collection takes place. Unfortunately, the codes indicate that you are ultimately responsible for any illegal dumping that occurs in front of your property. A call to the police department to report the issue creates a record, but removal of the bulk remains your responsibility. information is provided to us as to the violator (such as a tag), we will pursue them to the full extent of the law. The maximum allowed size of a pile remains the same: 12 cubic yards.
- For properties, such as those located along Stirling Road, where a guard rail is in place, there is no space for resident to place their bulk. These residents may locate the generated bulk across the street from them. Your bulk in this case, needs to be separated from the other property owner's bulk, and the Town should be notified of this action. The reason for the notification is that multiple piles if out together may create an amount larger than the *maximum allowed*

amount of 12 cubic yards that are allowed per bulk collection date, and may not be picked up by our vendor.

- Placement of construction material will not be picked up.

  Any debris of this type requires a special pickup by the new vendor, or to acquire a construction dumpster for the pickup of the items.
- Nurseries are considered commercial entities, and as such require a commercial account with the corresponding container.
   No bulk will be collected from the nurseries at all.
- Vacant properties are not allowed to place bulk from their property.
   No bulk will be collected from these locations.
- In addition, it is also imperative to understand, that our Town in an effort to continue to be as rural as possible, does not have street lighting, and any bulk that protrudes unto the street, can become a hazard to drivers at night. As such bulk needs to always be away from the street or as far as possible from the edge of the road to avoid any possible accidents.
- Placement of bulk on the same location during every collection week, becomes detrimental to the swale are. As such we ask that you alternate locations in front of your property to avoid gouging and creation of a large hole that would need to be repaired.

The Town needs your help by adhering to the information above. We are here to help you understand the process and get items that were left behind by mistake. As such please contact the Town as soon as possible to resolve any issues. The Town of Southwest Ranches works with all residents to make sure that all their needs are met.




